- » Resurfacing the parking lot and installing new lighting; and
- » Funding the purchase of a new digital marguee.





## **TOTAL INVESTMENT IN STREET SCHOOL: \$858,044**

## **PROPOSITION 1: SAFE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS - \$189,188**

- » Fire and security alarms
- » Security cameras and radios
- » Safe entry and door access control
- » Parking lot, sidewalk, and exterior LED lighting
- » School and classroom furniture
- » Air quality/HVAC replacements federally funded by the **CARES** Act

- » Network and systems upgrades
- » Student and teacher technology

- » Wellness and physical education




Project totals are estimates and will be adjusted to ensure projects are completed. Totals based on pupil count will be adjusted to reflect current enrollment.
